A fine and important embroidered purple velvet nobleman's robe, (joma), Bukharan, late 19th century, worked with Ottoman inspired embroidered flower-heads and acanthus scrolls with diapered patterns in gold and silver thread, lined in scarlet moiré silk brocade with flowers, needle-braid borders

Exhibited at the Museum for Islamic Art, Jerusalem.
